

Heartland Presbytery Meeting Highlights February 20, 2010

The Presbytery gathered with prayer at the Southminster Presbyterian Church in Prairie Village, KS. The Rev. Chad Herring was installed as Moderator and he, along with Rev. Landon Whitsitt preached the sermon "Living in Exile" based on Jeremiah 29:4-5 and Luke 10:1-11. The \$1,172 offering was equally divided between the Interfaith Hospitality Network of Johnson County and the Harold Thomas Center Community Mission Fund.

The presbytery dissolved the First Presbyterian Church of Kansas City, KS, at their request effective June 2, 2010. (There is a contract pending on the sale of their former facilities that may close on June 1.) The presbytery gave thanks to God for the 129 years of mission and ministry in Wyandotte County by the congregation. A litany of celebration and a photographic montage were shared by the church.

The presbytery approved ordination for two candidates: Amy Ramirez-Spears of the Grandview Park, Kansas City, KS, and Bonnie Grabowski of Northminster in Kansas City. Amy will be pastor at First, Mitchell, IN. Bonnie will be pastor at First, Savannah, MO.

The presbytery welcomed several transferring ministers: Rev. David Carlson to First, Independence, MO; Rev. Andrew Florio to Chapel Hill, Blue Springs, MO; Rev. Robert Dahlgren to King City/Albany churches; Rev. Tim Soule to Westminster, Ottawa, KS; and Rev. David Winters, HR.

The Presbytery commissioned several travelers to Thawke Village, Kenya, where the presbytery's newest mission project will be located which will include construction of a church, medical clinic, and a bore hole. A fall trip to Maya Quiche with the Guatemalan Partnership is also being formed.
