

Heartland Presbytery Meeting Highlights April 20, 2010

The Presbytery gathered with prayer at the First Presbyterian Church in Pleasant Hill, MO. The Rev. Leslie King, Pastor of First, Osawatomie, KS preached the sermon “Abundantly Not Enough” based on Exodus 16:13-26 and Mark 6:34-44,51-52. The total of the morning worship and Noisy Offering was \$1,986.88 and was equally divided between the Haitian Fellowship for earthquake relief, the Heartland Presbyterian Center Campership Fund and the Harold Thomas Center Community Mission Fund.

The presbytery examined and welcomed the Reverend Leigh B. Gillis who accepted the call to be Associate Executive Presbyter for Congregational Vitality beginning June 1. Leigh is currently serving as a pastor in North Carolina.

The Presbytery heard a report from the travelers to Thwake Village, Kenya, where the presbytery’s newest mission project a medical clinic has a floor and walls. Once the clinic is completed, a bore hole will be constructed so that the villagers no longer travel a mile each way to the nearest water source. The Thwake travelers documented their trip in a moving video and photo presentation.

The Council reported that the first quarter of 2010 ended well for the per capita budget but the shared mission budget is significantly behind where it should be. The presbytery also approved an open search process for the office of Stated Clerk at the end of each three year term.
